79/21	Cemetery Matters: Work in the Cemetery and Churchyard has been carried by council members and volunteers from the village. 9 green bins were filled from the Churchyard!

81/21	Report from Rupert Frost: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. A Community Fund has been established to assist voluntary groups in the light of Covid 19, AN later added that she had the documentation.2. 212 refugees are currently being assisted by the authority3. 13.8% Of crimes have been solved; this is above the national average4. The report from the Fire Service has been received. The delay in the arrival of the engines is still of concern. There is a 10 minute difference in that given by the service and that given by residents. It is likely that this is due to the call from the village going to a national service and then being diverted to the local emergency service. 999 Calls from mobile phones are not logged on the device and the precise time of the initial call cannot be checked. The advice is to use a landline if possible as this is directed to the local service and the time is logged. Discussion on this incident will continue.	
82/21	AOB: PM reported on a conversation with a resident of Litchborough about the development of a site near Tiffield to provide extensive warehouse storage for DHL. There is significant concern about potential traffic issues on the A43 and A5, particularly when there are problems on the M1. Council agreed, but it is understood that the planning has already been agreed. LM provided her invoice for her work as Clerk from April-October and a cheque for £280.20 was signed by PS and SS
