	chalets will be larger to accommodate more guests, though the overall number of visitors	
	will not increase. It is also planned to increase the size of the re-cycling area with 700	
	solar panels towards the Mantels Heath side of the property. It was agreed that Rupert

	drift and asking for an extension of the consultation period, particularly as the amended	
	application had not been sent to the Council for their comments.

29/24	Finance: LM presented the budget report for the year to date. The balance on the ledger at July

	The contract for the supply of electricity to the street lamps from SSE, arranged by LM	
	5years ago, expires at the end of July. This has given us an exceptional good rate. Quotes for the	
	next 1 and 2 years will double the cost, but the company is still very competitive with other
